HELPFUL HINTS

Each year, thousands of children and adults are burned by tap water. These burns can be prevented.

Tap water can scald or burn

- Hot Water Tank's setting should be 120 degrees F.
- Put a small slide-bolt latch on the bathroom door.
 This will prevent children from entering the bathroom without supervision.

In the bath

- The water in a child's bath should **not** be higher than 100.1 degrees F.
- Run cold water into the tub first, then add hot water to reach a safe temperature.
- Fill the tub no higher than the baby's belly button.
- Before placing a child into the bathtub, check the temperature of the water by inserting the BATH THERMOMETER card. The crystal should register **OK** before placing the child into the tub.
- Face the child away from the faucets and keep them closer to the other end of the tub (away from the faucets).

NOTE: THIS CARD SHOULD ONLY BE USED AS A GUIDE. It is suggested that you test the water with your elbow as an additional precaution before bathing.
